III. "Sustainability by Design" Projects.

- A. **Partner/Visitor:** Dr. Clarice Hutchins/Bioremediation, Pfizer Biotech, Green Chemistry/Sustainability Team. Comfort Bears and Blankets update. She is working with Lydia's House for some of the bears and blankets; the rest of the bears/blankets will go to a social welfare agency in a Louisiana city whose residents were flooded in 2016 and lost most of their possessions. Other countries being considered for the bears and blankets are Peru and Nicaragua.
- B. **PRACAC 11/19/16 meeting** – Darcy reported that is not meeting in December; new chair is Mike Wehlen; next year is re-accreditation by CAPRA ; the committee elected Gary Stein as vice-chair. Farmer's market sub-committee will meet on January 14; Guy Tilman reported that there is some interest by a property owner to provide an opportunity for the market in Old Chesterfield; more details to follow as the Planning Commission examines the idea.

- F. **Upcycling Recycling in Chesterfield Parks update** – potential 2017 Grant Opportunity for sustainable materials management – Bob, Su, Darcy, Libbey.
1. Update summation as result of 11-15-16 meeting – Bob, Su. Add more later. Map from McCarthy for all recycle unity; Libby wants to get a letter from Republic committing to measuring recycle and landfill materials; Lisa B. will work on design/graphics for the units. Power point presentation will be replaced by a skit/show and tell by McCarthy and staff for attendees at Amphitheater events. Three concert dates in 2017 and 2018.
 2. Portal placement of recycle unit of choice thus far. As long as we follow city procurement procedures, we should be ok with County Grant Procedure.

 4. BiAnnual Grow-Off Aps. There are only two on file now.

5. Cloth Bag Sleeves to store plastic bags to be recycled/reused are being worked on by Charity-Sharity – we need approximately 325? Update Plastic Bags? Flyer – Su G.

6. Vendor contact information turn in now to Libbey ASAP because the Initial EBlast Invitation goes out in January, 2017! Please turn in at least one per member.

7. Where/when do we put our Earth Day tabletop? Library placement dates will be cleared. What dates: Donna/Jeanne et al.?

8. Give away native flora: two milkweeds and two Fall nectar flora; cost factors are being reviewed with our vendors; we have a choice of \$120 or \$140 for different trays, the best bargain is the \$140 per tray. We will be receiving six flats total, four flats of two different native milkweed and two separate flats, one of native goldenrod and one aster for nectar plants during the Fall. CCE approved the \$140 tray cost.

10. Wildseed Farms Seed Catalogs, Donna, Jeanne C.: pollinator mix, cut flowers/annuals, or wildflower mix; catalogs were distributed to all members.

H. End of Year Metrics – Darcy reported on all CCE’s accomplishments during 2016 and distributed/discussed a summary of the report we submitted to the City through Libby, though a few metrics are still missing and will be added when the information becomes available.
