1. Approval of Minutes as written
Darcy made a motion to approve

Guest speaker - Garnish Krishnamurthy representing a group of people in the community who play Cricket. He would like to find a place to play Cricket in the Community. Grass field is not an option, as they need to bounce the ball...need turf or concrete pad with carpet on top.

Asian American community in Chesterfield who want to play the game, more than 150 kids playing. American Cricket Academy.

Neighboring cities (O'fallon and Ballwin) have space. 10' X 100'. They need multiple fields, but interested in 1 field to start.

Giridhar Sriperumbudoor "Gary" also spoke. They teach leadership and community values when teaching kids Cricket. Traveling all over the country to play Cricket, nothing in Chesterfield. Widely recognized by ICC (International Cricket Council).

Darcy mentioned she read an informative article about Cricket in The Post Dispatch recently. Very complimentary. Tom mentioned he met with Ganish yesterday to stay this discussion
Bill asked if there was space in Railroad Park.
Darcy asked if Tom needs a formal motion from the committee. Tom said we need further discussion.

Season for Cricket is mid-March through September
Field is the size of 2 soccer fields. Surface is clay, is 12' X 100' and covered by carpet with grass surrounding (vision needs 3-4 pitches aka Fields)

The surface is critical for playing. Darcy would like to open up a brainstorming session. Tom will continue talking with Ganish.

David Kaplan - Update on Green Trails Park & Riverbend Park improvements. He spoke with PTO, ready to commit money, but need to vote to determine how much. There was a question on how much the city in the past has contributed to playground improvements. David also requested information on how to become a member on the Parks, Recreation and Arts Citizens Advisory Committee and, more specifically, if he could fill the vacant position in Ward 1.

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Darcy mentioned Green Trails is also a partner in a native habitat garden.

Tom met with Green Trails on 6/9, including the principal. Concerns with entrapment and outdated. Discussed general ideas for the playground.

Restroom is the big need with pavilion (review April minutes for budget examples)

- possibly splitting costs at \$175K each
- Pavilion use for weekends and ideal use for school scouts, programs, summer camps, etc.

Guy – We lack parks in residential neighborhoods - Ward I and Ward II, limited parks in Ward IV. So, should we have a comprehensive plan in residential neighborhoods? We need a plan for revenue stream to develop the plan.

Darcy may need a model to develop the plan.

Kari said the comprehensive evaluation is in 2017 (occurs every 15 years).

Cindy mentioned this opportunity at Green Trails Park can serve as an example for moving forward. Tom said he will present this to the Council and update after
