Also in attendance was Troop Leader Tom Smyka.

Reverend John Wilson from West County Assembly of God led the City Council in prayer.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes of the March 18, 1996, City Council meeting were submitted for approval. A motion was made by Councilmember Cullen, seconded by Councilmember Flachsbar, to approve the minutes. A voice vote was taken with a unanimous affirmative result and the motion was declared passed.

Mayor Jack Leonard recognized and requested Judge Rick Brunk to preside at the swearing-in ceremony. Judge Brunk administered the Oath of Office to Councilmember Barry Flachsbart - Ward I, Councilmember-Elect Larry Grosser - Ward II, Councilmember Alan Politte - Ward III and Councilmember Linda Tilley - Ward IV.

A roll call vote was taken, again, this time of the newly-elected officials of the City of Chesterfield with the following results:

The newly-installed Councilmembers thanked their campaign Committees and the residents of their respective Wards.

INTRODUCTORY REMARKS

Mayor Leonard noted that he had submitted a nominee for the Board of Police Commissioners to the Public Health and Safety Committee and interviews will be held at the next Committee meeting.

Mayor Leonard announced that the Annual Kiwanis Prayer Breakfast has been scheduled for April 25, 1996, at the Doubletree Hotel and Conference Center.

Mayor Leonard next announced that the next regular meeting of City Council has been scheduled for May 20, 1996, at 7:30 P.M.

COMMUNICATIONS AND PETITIONS

Reverend Robert Smith, who resides at 15362 Olive Boulevard, expressed his desire that religious tolerance and harmony be supported by the Chesterfield community.

Rabbi Howard Kaplansky, who resides at 642 Stablestone Drive, expressed his desire that religious tolerance and diversity be supported by the Chesterfield community.

Ms. Patricia Hearst, who resides at 14790 Greenloch Court, commended Councilmember Ed Levinson for his contribution to the Chesterfield community while serving as Councilmember of Ward II and criticized what she characterized as an "anti-development" perspective adopted by City Council.

COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS

Public Health and Safety

Councilmember Colleen Hilbert, Chairperson of the Public Health and Safety Committee, reported that the Committee recommends the approval of the installation of street lights on Olive Boulevard at the Faust Park entrance. A motion was made by Councilmember Hilbert, seconded by Councilmember Tilley, for the installations at this location. A voice vote was taken with a unanimous affirmative result and the motion was declared passed. The Committee also approved the installation of a street light on Chesterfield Airport Road. A motion was made by Councilmember Hilbert, seconded by Councilmember Tilley, to approve the installation of a street light on Chesterfield Airport Road at the curve by the Smoke House and Annie Gunn's restaurant. A voice vote was taken with a unanimous affirmative result and the motion was declared passed. On a motion by Councilmember Hilbert, seconded by Councilmember Tilley, Council voted unanimously to approve a transfer \$5,200 from Contingency Fund to cover the cost of these installations.

Councilmember Tilley, on behalf of Councilmember Hilbert, next reported that the Committee recommends approval of an informal procedure for the installation of yield signs, when requested or determined necessary by Staff. Ordinances must also be approved by Council. A motion was made by Councilmember Tilley, seconded by Councilmember Flachsbarth, to approve this policy. A voice vote was taken with a unanimous affirmative result and the motion was declared passed.

Councilmember Hilbert next reported that Bill #'s 1205 - 1207 will be considered for adoption under the Legislation portion of the agenda.

Planning and Zoning

Councilmember Dan Hurt, Acting-Chairperson of the Planning and Zoning Committee, reported that Bill #'s 1208 - 1212 will be considered for adoption under the Legislation portion of the agenda. He noted that Bill #1213 which has been placed on the agenda will be held.

Councilmember Hurt announced that the next meeting of this Committee has been scheduled for May 2, 1996, at 5:30 P.M.

Public Works/Parks

Councilmember Alan Politte, Chairperson of the Public Works/Parks Committee, noted as information that the conceptual site plans for the central City park site and the Chesterfield elementary site have been approved by the Parks, Recreation and Arts Citizen Advisory Committee and the Public Works/Parks Committee of City Council. Councilmember Politte commended Ron Coleman, Superintendent of Parks, Recreation and Arts, for his efforts in working with the consultant in finalizing the plans for these two parks.

Councilmember Politte next noted for information that the Chesterfield Citizens for the Environment Committee has developed a request for proposals for garbage/recycling/yard waste collection that would be sent out to contractual waste haulers. This RFP was received/approved by the Public Works/Parks Committee of Council. Bids received will be reviewed by the Chesterfield Citizens for the Environment and their recommendation will be forwarded to the Public Works/Parks Committee for further review before forwarding to City Council for a final decision.

Councilmember Politte next reported that it was necessary to change the diameter of the water pipe to be installed to serve the Public Works Maintenance Facility under construction. The cost of this change order will be offset by St. Louis County Water Department. A motion was made by Councilmember Politte, seconded by Councilmember Hilbert, to approve the change order to accommodate the larger pipe size. A voice vote was taken with a unanimous affirmative result and the motion was declared passed.

Finance and Administration

The Committee had no pending items that required action.

REPORT OF THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR

City Administrator Mike Herring introduced Mr. Jerry Kelley, the newly-hired Director of Planning and welcomed him to the Council meeting.

Mr. Herring reported that U.S. Ice Sports Complex, located at 16851 North Outer Forty, has requested a Sunday sales liquor license, in addition to the beer only liquor license previously issued to them. A motion was made by Councilmember Streeter, seconded by Councilmember Hurt, to approve the Sunday sales license. A voice vote was taken with a unanimous affirmative result and the motion was declared passed.

Mr. Herring next reported that Nobleman Pizza, located at 16851 Olive Street Road, formerly Noble Roman's Pizza, has requested a beer, wine and Sunday sales liquor license. A motion was made by Councilmember Cullen, seconded by Councilmember Tilley, to approve issuance of the licenses. A voice vote was taken with a unanimous affirmative result and the motion was declared passed.

Mr. Herring next reported that Chili's Grill and Bar, under construction at 955 Chesterfield Center, has requested a liquor license to sell all kinds of intoxicating liquor by the drink for consumption on the premise and Sunday sales. A motion was made by Councilmember Streeter, seconded by Councilmember Cullen, to approve issuance of these licenses. A voice vote was taken with a unanimous affirmative result and the motion was declared passed.

Mr. Herring next reported that Romano's Macaroni Grill, under construction at 963 Chesterfield Center, has requested a liquor license to sell all kinds of intoxicating liquor by the drink for consumption on the premise and Sunday sales. A motion was made by Councilmember Streeter, seconded by Councilmember Cullen, to approve issuance of these licenses. A voice vote was taken with a unanimous affirmative result and the motion was declared passed.

Mr. Herring next reported that bids were recently opened for work to be performed citywide with regard to the 1996 concrete slab replacement program. The low bid was submitted by Vee-Jay Construction Company, totaling \$1,749,658.30. The 1996 budget contains an allocation of \$1,992,819 for concrete slab replacements citywide. The difference between the low bid and the budgeted amount totals \$243,160.70. Director of Public Works/City Engineer Mike Geisel recommends that \$100,000 be allocated for inspection services, as provided by Professional Service Industries, which is the firm the City used last year, and the balance of \$143,160.70 be used to accommodate additional construction/slab replacement citywide. A motion was made by Councilmember Politte, seconded by Councilmember Streeter, to approve the contract with Vee-Jay, not to exceed \$1,892,819 and a second separate contract for Professional Service Industries, totaling \$100,000. A voice vote was taken with a unanimous affirmative result and the motion was declared passed.

Mr. Herring next reported that Director of Public Works/City Engineer Mike Geisel recommends the acceptance of the bid submitted by Contractors and Municipal Sweeping Service Company, Inc., totaling \$15,100 for a spring and fall sweeping, as well as an as-needed basis, at a rate of \$55.00/hour. A motion was made by Councilmember Politte, seconded by Councilmember Tilley, to award the contract to Contractors and Municipal Sweeping Service Company, Inc., totaling \$15,100 for the spring and fall sweeping and the rate of \$55.00/hour on an as-needed basis. A voice vote was taken with a unanimous affirmative result and the motion was declared passed.

Mr. Herring next reported that Mr. Geisel recommends awarding of a contract to Baxter Gardens of Chesterfield, totaling \$10,787 for the planting of ninety (90) new trees and the mulching of 100 existing trees, at the intersection of I-64 and Clarkson/Olive. The project will be funded by a total of 1996 budget allocation of \$65,000. This is the first of several projects to be recommended for approval by City Council. A motion was made by Councilmember Politte, seconded by Councilmember Hurt, to approve the contract to Baxter Gardens in an amount of \$10,787. A voice vote was taken with a unanimous affirmative result and the motion was declared passed. Councilmember Hurt commended the Beautification Committee and the Chesterfield Citizens for the Environment Committee for

their continuing efforts to assist in the beautification of the City.

Mr. Herring next reported that bids had been sought for the printing of four issues of the Chesterfield Citizen newsletter. The low bid was received from Western Press, totaling \$10,800. Mr. Herring joined with Finance Director Jan Hawn in recommending that the low bid submitted from Western Press be accepted. A motion was made by Councilmember Cullen, seconded by Councilmember Flachsbart, to award the contract to Western Press in the amount of \$10,800. A voice vote was taken with a unanimous affirmative result and the motion was declared passed.

Mr. Herring next reported that a rough draft of the next issue of the Chesterfield Citizen newsletter had been placed in the packets for review by Council. With no major changes to be made, Mr. Herring stated that the newsletter would be put in final form and that distribution to the businesses and resident should occur the first of May.

NEW BUSINESS

A motion was made by Councilmember Hurt, seconded by Councilmember Politte, to approve the Council Committee assignments shown above. A voice vote was taken with a unanimous affirmative result and the motion was declared passed.

Councilmember Hilbert stated that she has received comments from resident in the community with regard to the placement of the new Chesterfield Fire Protection District firehouse near River Valley Drive and suggested that this issue be referred to the Public Health and Safety Committee. After some discussion, Councilmember Flachsbart made a motion to schedule a public meeting on April 29 for the purpose of receiving citizen comments on issues relating to the Chesterfield Fire Protection District, that an invitation be extended to the CFPD Board and that the Mayor and City Council moderate the meeting. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Tilley. Discussion ensued. Councilmember Politte amended the motion to state that the League of Women Voters moderate the meeting, pending acceptance by the League, and Councilmembers Flachsbart and Tilley agreed to amend the motion to reflect this suggestion. It was also suggested that other governmental entities be invited to the meeting. Councilmember Cullen amended the motion to state that if the League of Women Voters cannot fulfill this responsibility that the Public Health and Safety Committee contact another organization to moderate. Councilmembers Flachsbart and Tilley agreed with this amendment. A voice vote was taken with a unanimous affirmative result and the motion was declared passed.

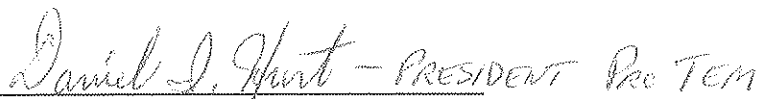
