II. PORTAL: minutes from 2/23/17 meeting, Republic year-to-date; Royal Oak Recycling (2/17- 6.345 tons); 2017s Demo. Garden Make-Over Gift from BiodiverCity and Butterfly House; 2017 Earth Day Flyer/Earth Day Tree Guide/LAYOUTS; Chesterfield What and Where; “International Earth Hour” Flyer 2017; CCE Brochure updated; Monarch/Pollinator Nexus List & Certificate; “4 Ps Make Chesterfield a Better Place” update, Su reported the green color is hard to read and needs to be changed; “WATER A Most Precious Resource” update; St. Louis County Dept. of Health Grant Application. Su posted the International Earth Hour on the portals of various groups while she was in India and here in St. Louis: South City Kolkata (India), a huge residential complex, India Association presidents in St. Louis, and St Louis Bengali group Punascha. Many thanks for her outreach efforts. Certificates given at Earth Day: St. John’s UCC, Butterfly House, Faust Park, Grow Native! Demo Garden and NWF Anchor Project Faust Park, Chesterfield Village Apartments, City Hall, road medians, YMCA, Amphitheater, Central Park Pool Area, Dierbergs Meditation Park, Eberwine Park, Professional Doctors Building, Pfizer/Monsanto, Chesterfield Elementary, Green Trails Elementary, Friendship Village, and Sachs Library (18 public sites in 17 years).

III. “Sustainability by Design” Projects.

- A. St. Louis County Dept. of Health Solid Waste Grant Filed-Pilot Project Recycling in Chesterfield Amphitheater – Libbey/Tom; filed on St. Patrick’s Day; we will hear on Monday, April 3 whether we were successful.
- B. Presenter: Stephen Herring, Republic Services Representative: issues, updates, trends. Concession recyclables (15 min.). He reported on updates. In 2016 most city recycling numbers were down but Chesterfield’s was **up 200 tons** to 4901 tons. Amphitheater recycling in single-stream: paper but no bathroom type waste, junk mail, file folders, newspapers, phone books, paperbacks, metal cans, plastic

containers and bottles with lids, glass containers (even broken), cardboard, all need not to be cleaned. Recycling at concessions stands will accept: aluminum foil, paper popcorn containers, small condiment containers, coffee lids but not cup, milk and juice cartons, paper food boats, plastic bottles, paper plates, plastic trays, clear plastic cups. Items that are **NOT** recyclable: coffee filters, plastic utensils, packing tissues, napkins and paper towels, Kleenex, foam cups and plates, latex gloves, and condiment packets, candy wrappers, Styrofoam plates and containers, and plastic bags/films. Public education is the biggest challenge. Republic will update their All-In-One flyer as to what is and isn't recyclable. Everyone needs to know what is and isn't recyclable in our parks. Jeanne T. suggested we should emphasize what is recyclable and not what isn't. Guy Tilman questioned Republic's plans for residential recycling containers. The larger the better or what is the transition process. Herring responded that Republic is going to the larger container if it is requested. A comment was made that older adults are having trouble moving the larger trash containers due to their weight. Su thinks we should refocus the recycle challenge on other areas of the house than the kitchen, such as the laundry and bathroom, maybe in the next City newsletter. Jeanne C. suggested that more pictures and fewer words are recommended. Gary Budoor said we need to reach out to apartments to get them to recycle. Stephen said that they are considered commercial enterprises so they are not on the same program. The City has reached out to apartments to no avail due to increased costs to tenants. Herring: Nationwide only 9.5% of businesses recycle. McCarthy reported that in Europe there are no trash or recycle containers. People bring trash in and haul it out but Americans aren't there yet.

- Buying Recycled Means Closing the Loop –Jeanne C. Flyer is completed and on the portal.
- Chesterfield What & Where – Donna: some businesses have dropped off and some added in terms of composting.
- Survey Questions/review for Earth Day – Ben: emailed today list of question to ask patrons on Earth Day; may need to cut it to fewer questions; list was generated by shredding options (on-site or off-site and how much they are willing to pay per unit of measure, per box, per pound, etc.). Maybe no charge if you just leave it but charge if you want to see it shredded. Be at the front of the line to ask questions. Ben will revise list by focusing on zip codes and shredding info to keep the number of questions to a minimum.
